# Objectives of VDO Ailumpur

1. Support poor members for their own development
2. Maximise utilisation of local resources
3. Socio-economic development of the village
4. Establish sustainable community organisations
5. Development of women
6. Linkage development with Govt and other agencies

# Criteria for CIF Lending

- For poorest and needy
- Only for women members
- NIC not required
- For those who can not access loans from any other organisations

# CIF Lending Procedures

1. The CO submits list of poorest members to VDO which VDO then submits to LSO
2. LSO distributes CIF amongst VDOs based on number of poorest HHS in each village
3. VDOS distribute CIF to member COs
4. Member COs distribute CIF to poorest members

# Purpose and duration of CIF loan

CIF loans were given for two purposes:

1. Livestock
2. Micro enterprise

Duration of loan: One year

Recovery installments: Six months

Repayment of service charges: Monthly
